- 3. Athletic documentation needs to be completed online in your Skyward account by both parent and student. You need to complete the pre-participation physical and the athletic documentation in order to participate in athletics at SME. - 4. A reminder that on Thursdays, Late Start classes do not begin until 8:50am, and teachers are not available to meet with students at that time. 

Your payment of fees is the final confirmation of your student's enrollment at East. We have several options for method and timing of payment. Remember that students may not report to class until fees and fines are paid.

Fee Collection Options

We have several options for the payment of fees. The mail-in deadline is **Monday, July 30**. The Internet online deadline is **August 10**. Walk-in payments are scheduled for July 31 (10:00am-2:00pm, August 2 (7:30am – 1:30pm) and August 7 (3:00pm—7:00pm) in the Aux Gym. *All students* should plan on visiting during our walk-in dates so that a student I.D. photo and Yearbook photo may be taken.

- Option 1 Internet payment: Payment, via credit card, is available beginning July 20. Fees can be paid online through either the SME homepage (under the "Parent Involvement" tab) or the district homepage (under the "Parents & Students" tab). All mandatory fees (textbook rental, ID card, & participation fee) MUST be paid prior to the purchase of optional items. There is a \$3.00 service charge for using the online payment system. Please print and retain your receipt in order to pick up IDs and parking permits on walk-in dates. Payments made online will take 24 hours to show up on your student's account.
- <u>Option 2</u> Mail in payment: Mail to Shawnee Mission East, 7500 Mission Road, SM, KS 66208. Payments should be mailed so that they arrive at the school by **Monday, July 30.** Please enclose page 3 with your payment.
- Option 3 Walk-in payment: Walk in payments will be accepted July 31, August 2 and August 7. We recommend walk-in payments for families who want to:
 - 1. Pay in cash.
 - 2. Set up a payment plan.
 - 3. Waive mandatory fees due to **KanCare Medicaid**—**Title 19 Only** (KanCare CHIP-Title 21 does not apply.) Please bring your state issued KanCare card (*Activity/Participation Fee can not be waived*).
 - 4. Enroll a new student.

Student I.D. Photos

We request that all students take a new student ID photo each year. I.D. photos will be taken July 31, August 2 and August 7 during fee collection. Student IDs will be distributed the first week of school.

Student Yearbook Photos

Yearbook photos for all students (except seniors) will be taken DURING FEE COLLECTION DATES: July 31, August 2 and August 7. We will also have make-up dates in September and/or October. *Please be aware that yearbook photos and I.D. photos are two separate photos. Make sure your student has BOTH an I.D. and yearbook photo taken.*

*** Senior panoramic photo will be taken at SME on Friday, August 17 at 7AM in the Gym.

Bus Information

Parent pay contract forms are available at the district website at www.smsd.org, click on "Parents & Students", then "Transportation" and then click on the "Bus Pay Contract" button.

Parking Permits - Seniors and Juniors ONLY may purchase a parking permit

Information regarding parking is included in the summer mailer. Please refer to that portion of the mailer for up-to-date information.

Student Course Schedules

Schedules will be available to view in Skyward on July 23rd. Please make note of this deadline: <u>All requests for schedule changes must be submitted via email to the student's counselor no later than Thursday, August 9th, at 3:00 p.m.</u> Students must attend the courses in their schedule in Skyward until a change has been made. Some changes will not be possible due to class sizes. No requests for changes to yearlong and first semester classes may be submitted after August 9th.

MacBook Check-Out

MacBook check out will be available during Fee Payment in the library. If you do not check out your MacBook during fee payment, it will be distributed during the first two days of school.

Senior Caps and Gowns

Seniors will purchase a cap and gown from Balfour. Purchases can be made online at www.balfour.com any time after school begins. The Balfour Representative will also give a presentation to seniors and hand out information packets. No money will be paid at fee payment.

MANDATORY FEES

ALL Mandatory fees MUST be paid first

BOOK RENTAL \$80.00

Assessed for all students enrolled at any Shawnee Mission High School. This fee is mandatory for all students.

STUDENT I.D. \$5.00

Required for all students. Picture taken at registration. Replacement cost is \$5.00. This fee is mandatory for all students.

ACTIVITY/PARTICIPATION FEE \$75.00

The Activity/Participation fee provides partial funding for extra-curricular and co-curricular programs offered at school. This fee is mandatory for all students.

COURSE FEES - varies

These fees cover the cost of materials in a number of different classes.

OPTIONAL FEES

Optional items can not be purchased until all mandatory fees are paid.

YEARBOOK - \$50.00

A descriptive and pictorial collection of memorable events at SME is captured in our yearbook called the HAUBERK. Recommended for all students. (\$60.00 fee is assessed if yearbooks are ordered after November 1.)

CLASS DUES - \$5.00

Used to finance your student's class activities such as charity drives, class picnics, prom, and the senior class gift.

STUDENT COUNCIL - \$10.00

The elected student government sponsors dances, intramural sports, a film festival, a band competition and a variety of charitable, social and civic activities for all students.

PEP CLUB MEMBERSHIP - \$10.00

Assessed to support Lancer athletics/activities.

PARKING PERMITS - \$60.00

Sold only to Seniors during fee payment days. Must complete and sign the Required Vehicle Information Form.

PICTURE PACKETS - Money paid directly to Interstate!

Picture packets are available for purchase if desired. Picture packets can be ordered at the time the yearbook picture is taken. NOTE: Hats, costumes and other unusual outfits will **not** be permitted for these pictures. There will be makeup dates in September and/or October.

Any elective course fees which are paid and subsequently dropped will be applied to open course fees or the student lunch account.

No refunds will be issued for courses dropped after two weeks into the semester.

Returned checks will be processed by a collection agency and a \$30 fee will be assessed for each returned item.

2018-2019 Parking Information for Seniors and Juniors ONLY

(Freshmen and Sophomores are NOT allowed to park on campus)

ALL MANDATORY FEES MUST BE PAID BEFORE A PARKING PASS CAN BE PURCHASED

Parking spaces for the 2018-2019 school year will be reserved for **seniors/juniors only**, who have a specific parking pass number. For example, if the parking pass number is 214, then that student will park in space 214. Seniors/juniors can choose to be in the West or South parking lots, however, will not be able to choose a specific parking spot. Numbers will be handed out in order. Since SME only has 600 student parking spots, seniors will have first chance at purchasing one. Juniors may purchase the remaining spots on a first come, first serve basis starting at noon on Thursday, August 9, 2018.

Seniors will be able to purchase a parking pass three ways:

- 1. Purchase online from July 20 through August 7th.
- 2. Purchase with cash/check/credit card at Registration Dates, July 31, August 2 and August 7.
- 3. Purchase with check/cash/credit card beginning August 9 at 8:00AM with the bookkeeper. (After August 9 at 12:00pm this opens up to juniors. Seniors WILL NOT be guaranteed a spot after that date/time.)

Seniors can pick up their parking pass (first come, first serve basis) on Thursday, August 9th at the main SME entrance beginning at 8:00am. (A parent may pick up the parking pass if the student is unavailable.)

Please bring the following to pick up your pass:

- 1. A copy of the receipt showing all fees paid.
- 2. The signed Parking Pass Agreement.
- 3. Seniors who have paid but miss the pick-up date can get their parking sticker during normal hours 7:00am-3:00pm.

Juniors may purchase and pick up any remaining passes on Thursday, August 9th beginning at 12:00pm. (Online purchasing WILL NOT be available for Juniors).

Please bring the following to purchase/pick up a pass:

- 1. \$60 check/cash/credit card to purchase the pass from the bookkeeper.
- 2. A copy of the receipt showing all fees paid.
- 3. The signed Parking Pass Agreement.

Shawnee Mission East High School Parking Rules and Regulations

Year-Long Parking permits are sold to juniors or seniors. Students without permits may park in the Prairie Village Pool lot, Harmon Park, and/or on Delmar Street. All Prairie Village City laws apply.

Only authorized vehicles will be permitted in the parking lots of Shawnee Mission East High School. All authorized vehicles must have a properly displayed parking permit affixed to the INSIDE rear window on the lower left (driver's side) corner. SME Administration reserves the right to refuse or revoke any student parking permit.

Rules and Regulations:

- 1. All parking lots are considered Shawnee Mission School District property; all actions, conduct and behavior is governed by Shawnee Mission School District discipline procedures 365 days a year, 24 hours a day, 7 days per week.
- 2. Students driving vehicles that are parked on school property shall be parked in designated student parking areas in the 75th St. and Mission Rd. parking lots.
- 3. Vehicles parked in established fire lanes, faculty spaces, reserved spaces, handicapped, NO parking zones, double parked, medians, or parked in a manner interfering with the flow of traffic, will be issued a citation. Egregious violations may result in the vehicle being towed at the owner's expense.
- 4. Authorized vehicles shall be driven in a safe, prudent manner and observe a speed limit of 15 mph on all school property. Unsafe driving can include, but is not limited to: speeding, reckless driving, driving the wrong way, driving over medians, grass, and exhibition of speed. Egregious violations may result in revocation of SME parking privileges.
- 5. All traffic signs shall be obeyed.
- 6. Students who park in staff parking or another student's spot will be issued a citation.
- 7. **Again,** all permits are to be affixed to the INSIDE rear window on the lower left (driver's side) corner.

Parking Violation Consequences:

1st Offense \$25.00 Fine

2nd Offense \$50.00 Fine

3rd Offense \$50.00 Fine Call to parents/guardian regarding parking issues.

4th Offense \$50.00 Fine Parking privilege revoked for 6 weeks.

5th Offense \$50.00 Fine Parking privilege revoked for entire school year.

Vehicles can be towed for egregious or repeated violations.

Resolution of Parking Citation

- 1) Parking Citations are issued by SRO/DRO's and/or District/Building Administration.
- 2) Students are required to pay the designated fine to SME bookkeeper (located in the Main Office) by the appeal date listed on the citation.
- 3) Students may appeal their citation to the Student Court on the date/time listed on the citation.
- 4) Unpaid parking fines could result in being referred to a collection agency.

Space is limited. SME will sell year-long parking permits to junior and senior students with the <u>understanding that purchasing a permit does not guarantee</u> the availability of a parking space. SM East will do its best to ensure that the student's parking space is available during each school day.



Dear Parents:

If your student is riding a school bus, please know that safety is a priority in the Shawnee Mission School District. We abide by regulations set forth by the Kansas State Department of Education/School Transportation as well as supplemental district policies and rules in order to maintain a safe and efficient transportation program. The bus ride is considered as an extension of the school day. Therefore, it is important that students understand all school rules that apply while riding on the bus. Additionally, buses are equipped with video cameras which record both visual and audio. Bus stops can be up to ¼ mile away for Elementary students and ½ mile away for Secondary students. Kindergarten and 1st graders will need an adult to be at the bus stop to receive the student.

Please review the safety regulations below with your student. Remember the bus is an extension of the school and class room and those rules apply as well. Failure to comply with these safety regulations may lead to a suspension of bus privileges.

School Bus Safety Regulations and Expectations

1. Prior to loading the bus students shall:

- Be on time! Students should be at the designated *bus stop 5 minutes prior to the stated time of bus arrival*. The bus cannot wait beyond its regular schedule.
- Conduct themselves in a safe manner while waiting for the bus.
- Be careful in approaching a bus. Remain ten feet from bus until the bus comes to a complete stop and the driver signals you to load.

2. On the bus students shall:

- Follow all school rules and expectations while on the bus. Show respect for self, other people, and property, including the bus and the bus driver.
- Remain seated with feet on the floor while the bus is in motion.
- Ask permission to adjust windows. Driver is in charge of bus.
- Keep all body parts and all objects inside the bus.
- No changing cloth's on the bus
- · Not bring food or drink aboard the bus
- Not bring animals, except service animals, on the bus.
- Not bring weapons of any type aboard the bus.
- Not bring or consume tobacco products, alcohol products or illegal drugs aboard the bus.
- Carry only backpacks, books, school supplies and coats on the bus. All other items must be approved by the driver before bringing them on the bus. The bus aisle must be kept clear.

3. When departing the bus students shall:

- When crossing the road, walk at least ten feet out and ten feet in front of the bus. The bus driver will signal when it is safe to cross the road; and student will also look to make sure that no traffic is approaching from either direction before crossing the road. Students should never cross the road behind the bus.
- Only get off the bus at their regular designated stop. The driver will not discharge riders at other places than the regular designated bus stop, unless proper authorization is received from the parent and a school official.

4. On extra-curricular trips students shall:

Follow the direction of the driver. The driver is in charge of the bus at all times.
 (Follow the above rules and regulations; they apply to any trip under school sponsorship)

Dear Class of 2022 Parent,

We are very excited that your child will be attending Shawnee Mission East High School this year and we look forward to meeting your student on the first day of school, Friday, August 10, 2018. As you may know, our school participates in the nationwide Link Crew Program, an organization whose sole purpose is to help freshmen feel more comfortable as well as help them achieve success in their first year of high school.

The Link Crew freshman orientation and transition program is designed to both welcome and support freshmen by assigning them a junior or senior Link Leader as a mentor during their first year at East. This Link Leader is a responsible older student who was hand selected from a large pool of applicants and has met the qualifications of being a good role model and a positive leader at our school.

- 2) As our first day of school activities are quite active, please be sure your student puts all personal items (lunch, backpack, purses, electronics) in his/her assigned locker before reporting to the cafeteria; the only thing students will need is their schedule.
- 3) Please make sure that your student wears comfortable clothing that does not restrict movement, so he/she will be able to fully participate.
- 4) This is a student only function so we ask you to let your child attend on his or her own.

Lastly, please be sure your 9th grader marks his/her calendar for the Link Crew Back-to-School Dance on Friday, August 17th from 7:00 to 9:00 p.m. in the East Cafeteria. This mixer is for 9th graders and Link Leaders only; admission is free. More details will be coming as the event draws closer!

Shawnee Mission East Code of Conduct

As members of the Shawnee Mission East community, we desire to promote an environment in which all individuals can realize their greatest potential. To achieve this goal we expect students, faculty, parents, administrators, and staff members to interact on and off campus in a respectful, honorable, and compassionate way. Negative interactions often take the form of bullying and harassment. Shawnee Mission East prohibits both forms of negative interaction.

Bullying is any hurtful, negative behavior that is done deliberately and is repeated especially after the victim has asked that it stop. Bullying can also be defined as one or more individual or group exposing another individual or group to negative actions/behavior on a one-time or repeated basis. This includes cyber-bullying.

Harassment is defined as engaging in unacceptable or inappropriate behavior toward another on the basis of sex, race, ethnicity, gender identity, sexual orientation, disability, religion, body type or other protected categories. For example, sexual harassment involves sexually-oriented or themed behavior that is unwelcome or offensive it its recipient. If the recipient of bullying or harassment feels comfortable doing so, she/he should immediately tell the offending individual(s) to stop the behavior.

If the unwelcome or offending behavior continues or if the individual or group feels too intimidated or embarrassed to inform the individual(s) to stop, then the student should report the instance using the bullying app provided on all devices. Shawnee Mission East will promptly investigate all complaints, either verbal or written, and take appropriate action against any student or employee who is found to have violated this policy.

Student Dress and Personal Appearance

DRESS CODE: If a student's appearance becomes a disruptive factor in the education process, a building administrator will ask the student to make the necessary changes. In the event that the change does not take place in the time allowed, the administrator will prescribe the consequences. Clothing with vulgar, profane, ethnically derogatory messages, pictures, symbols, or depictions of gangs, illegal substances, or alcoholic beverages may not be worn. Hats will be worn outside only. For further information about the school dress code, refer to your school guidelines.

Additionally, a student's clothing or appearance which is vulgar, indecent, obscene or insulting, or which promotes or encourages behavior such as smoking, drinking, drug use, physical or sexual violence or the use of illegal substances, or which promotes illegal activities is prohibited.

STUDENT DRESS AND PERSONAL APPEARANCE: The general atmosphere of a school must be conducive to learning. Generally, attire at school should be considered "learning outfits" which are different from those that might be considered more suitable for evening wear or an exercise class. A student's clothing or general appearance which materially or substantially interferes or disrupts the educational environment or invades the rights of others is prohibited. Additionally, a student's clothing or appearance which is vulgar, indecent, obscene or insulting, or which promotes or encourages behavior such as smoking, drinking, drug use, physical or sexual violence or the use of illegal substances, or which promotes illegal activities is prohibited. Outdoor clothing such as headgear, sunglasses, gloves, coats, etc., is to be removed upon entering the building and stored in lockers or other school designated areas.

HATS/HOODIES/BANDANAS/COATS AND OUTDOOR WEAR: Hats, hoodies, and bandanas are not to be worn or seen in the building during the school day. Hats should be left in cars, lockers, or backpacks. Items confiscated by a staff member may be kept in the office until the end of the school year. If any of the above items are confiscated by a staff member, they will be kept until a parent picks the item up from the office.

CHAINS: To insure the safety of all students, chains are not to be worn. Chains will be confiscated and violators are subject to disciplinary actions.

- Producing a musical can cost anywhere from \$18,000 to \$30,000. Expenses include: royalties, set construction, backdrop rental, costumes, music, stage lighting, programs, choreography, sound system, publicity...
- District funds only cover royalties for plays and musicals. On average, royalties cost \$100 for a play and \$3000 for a musical.
- The Theatre Department is responsible for maintenance of the auditorium, which is used by ALL school departments. This includes lighting and sound for ALL auditorium spaces for ALL events.
- Our teachers are contracted to produce ONE play & ONE musical per school year. We are so fortunate Tom
 DeFeo and Brian Cappello generously give their time and talent to produce 4 mainstage productions,
 Repertory and Advanced Repertory shows (14 additional shows for 2018-2019) The mainstage shows are
 chosen strictly for the educational benefit of the students, not for ticket sale opportunities.
- Tech equipment is in constant need of upgrades, both for technological advancements and student safety. Just a FEW past purchases and future needs: Genie Lift \$15K, lighting console \$7-9K, safety ladders \$750 each, panel saw \$1300, fly system rigging upgrades \$50K, backstage monitoring system \$25K.... ETC.


