Community Information

Founded in 1958, Shawnee Mission East is one of five high schools in the Shawnee Mission School District located in the suburban Kansas City area. Parts of eight cities — Fairway, Leawood, Mission Hills, Mission Woods, Prairie Village, Overland Park, Westwood and Westwood Hills—are included in the East attendance area. It is in a residential area of largely middle- to upper-middle-class families with a population base exceeding 50,000.

Accreditation

Shawnee Mission East is a comprehensive four-year public high school with a strong emphasis on college preparation. Typically, more than 90 percent of its graduates seek higher education; however, the school's curriculum is designed to meet the academic needs of the entire student body. The curriculum includes career and vocational programs and easy access to the Area Vocational Technical School. An extensive special education program is available to students with exceptional academic needs. East delivers these services under the accreditation of the Kansas State Department of Education.

Staff

Shawnee Mission East has 111 certified staff members, 89 of whom have a master's degree; 4 have earned doctorates. The East staff shows remarkable stability, averaging 18 years of teaching experience. The current ratio of certified staff to students is 1 to 16.

Programs of Special Interest

Advanced Placement — Rigorous college preparatory courses are offered in all content areas and students may earn advanced standing and college credit through Advanced Placement (AP) testing and concurrent enrollment college courses.

International Baccalaureate Diploma Program — This rigorous European-style college preparatory program offers highly motivated, academically talented students an opportunity for in-depth scholar-ship and meaningful community service. The IB diploma is recognized in 57 countries and may qualify graduates for college credits.

College Now, Baker University and Quick Step Programs — These programs allow students to earn college credit while still in high school.

SHARE Program — Through our nationally recognized service program SHARE, students at East volunteer more than 25,000 hours annually to such important groups as the homeless and special needs children.

Career Development — Signature and Career training programs at East include marketing education, auto mechanics, business technology, pre-engineering and computer-aided design, law and public service, culinary arts, medical health science, and intro to biotechnology.

Fine Arts Department — East's diverse fine arts program has helped students receive local, state, and national recognition. More than 2/3 of the student population is actively involved.

Shawnee Mission East implemented a modified block schedule during the 2008-2009 school year. Students attend seven periods on Mondays, Tuesdays, and Fridays; Hours 1, 3, 5, 7 (odd hours) on Wednesdays; and Hours 2, 4, 6 (even hours) and Seminar on Thursdays. The goal of the Seminar program is to provide additional time during the school day for academic support. Students are assigned a pass/fail grade for Seminar attendance and participation. This grade does not affect the overall GPA. Shawnee Mission Public Schools do not rank students.

To recognize the higher expectations for students in Honors, Advanced Placement and International Baccalaureate courses, SME awards honor grade points. For certain advanced courses an A earns 5 points and a B earns 4 points. Other grades earn points as indicated above.
